Development Partners Meeting 2012

The Meeting

- Noted & Commended the CI on the 2nd NSDP
- Noted the economic position is stable with downside risks
- Recognized the CI commitment to robust PFM systems that are transparent and participative.
- Welcomed the ODA policy aimed at partnerships for development impact

The Meeting

- Noted the phased approach to reforms and the focus on service delivery and reach guided by national priorities.
- Noted the usefulness of a shared performance (policy) assessment matrix owned and developed by the CI.

The Meeting

- Agreed the need to increase efforts to coordinate with each other and acknowledged the power of shared forums such as this meeting.
- Noted the potential benefits of a Core Working Group arrangement and agreed to work towards an arrangement appropriate to the CI

The Meeting

- Acknowledged the efforts to develop the CI RE chart & ambitious implementation plan.
- Acknowledged the potential to leverage private sector investment to contribute to meeting targets.
- Noted the important contribution of energy efficiency to reducing demand

The Meeting

- Noted the increased progress towards national Water & Sanitation goals and establishment of a dedicated WatSan unit.
- Recognized the need for sustainable funding for Water and sanitation service delivery improvements

The Meeting

- Commended the call by the CI for development partners to form a Water & Sanitation partnership led by the CIG.
- Acknowledged the CI priorities of renewable energy, water & sanitation and public service improvements.

- We will set out a more concrete path for water and seek feedback on involvement.
- We will follow up with bilateral discussions and then follow up with interested partners.
- We will begin work on a coordinated performance assessment matrix.
